

Program for Young People and Residents with Foreign Roots (2026)

This program is a Japanese language support program for young people aged 15 and over, and residents with foreign roots who wish to learn Japanese for living and working in Japan.

In addition to everyday conversation, students will also learn basic reading and writing skills such as hiragana, katakana, and introductory kanji.

Students can also take conversation classes to obtain information necessary for daily life, as well as employment support classes (Japanese for the workplace, how to write a resume, interview preparation, individual consultations, etc.).

※ All classes are held online.

※ Some classes require the purchase of materials.

【Class Overview】

Morning Classes

(1) Beginner Japanese Level 1 (N5 equivalent)

(2) Beginner Japanese Level 2 (N5–N4 equivalent)

※ These are conversation-focused beginner level classes.

Afternoon Classes

(3) JLPT N4 (Grammar)

※ For those who have completed foundational study and wish to strengthen grammar skills

Mon & Wed 13:10–15:00 (16 sessions total / 2 months)

Textbook: 'TRY! Japanese Language Proficiency Test N4 Grammar' (Ask)

(4) Daily Life Kanji (N4 equivalent)

※ For those who have completed foundational study and wish to improve kanji skills

Mon & Wed 13:10–15:00 (16 sessions total / 2 months)

Textbook: 'Kanji Tamago Pre-Intermediate' (Bonjinsha)

(5) Japanese for Settled Residents (N4–N3)

※ For those who wish to develop communication skills necessary for life in Japan

Fri 13:10–15:00 (8 sessions total / 2 months)

(6) Japanese for Work (N4–N3)

※ For those who wish to learn workplace manners, Japanese conversation, resume writing, and interview preparation

Fri 13:10–15:00 (8 sessions total / 2 months)

Textbook: 'Japanese for Working: Career Planning' (Learns)

- Employment Support & Seminars

Based on individual needs, we offer seminars and individual consultations on job searching, Japan's employment system, and social security.

- Those who do not understand Japanese and cannot access necessary information or administrative services
- Foreign parents, young people with foreign roots, refugees, etc., who are struggling to find a place to learn Japanese
- Those with a Wi-Fi environment
